

AARP

Absentee Ballots

Prior to elections and referenda, absentee ballots are available to qualified registered voters at the Town Clerk's Office. An application for an absentee ballot will be mailed to you upon request. 860-285-1902.

Accident Reports - Automobile

Most insurance companies contact the Police Department directly to request motor vehicle accident reports on personal injury or damage claims exceeding \$1,000. Copies of the report can be obtained at the Public Safety Complex, 340 Bloomfield Avenue, at the cost of \$0.50 per copied page. Each incident is given a case number at the scene. Please ask for the report by the case number or by the date and location of the accident. 860-688-5273.

Adult Education

The Adult Education program serves the educational needs of adult residents sixteen years of age or older through a variety of evening programs offered each spring and fall at Windsor High School. They include high school completion, adult basic literacy, English language and citizenship instruction as well as general interest courses in the areas of arts & crafts, computers, dance, health & fitness, home & garden, languages, literature & writing, money management and personal growth and Recreation. High school completion, adult basic literacy and English language instruction are available during the day at the L.P. Wilson Community Center. Agricultural Experiment Station (State of CT)

Located at 153 Cook Hill Road, this agency will answer questions related to agriculture or home gardening. In addition, they will diagnose plant and soil problems, identify insects and test ticks for Lyme disease. Their services are provided to Windsor residents free of charge. 860-683-4977.

Appeal of Property Assessment and Real Property Taxes

The Board of Assessment Appeals, which is composed of three private citizens, meets twice a year to hear appeals for those disputing their assessments. The September meeting is usually held on a Saturday and is exclusively for motor vehicles. The March meetings are determined annually by the number of individuals who wish to appeal and are open for any type of property, real estate, motor vehicle and personal property appeals. For the March meetings, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes, applications to meet before the board must be filed with the Town Assessor starting on February 1st and filed no later than February 20th. Failure to comply with this requirement constitutes a waiver to meet with the Board for that year. 860-285-1817 or visit townofwindsorct.com/assessor.

Birth Certificates

Birth certificates are available in the Town Clerk's Office in the town where the birth occurred, the town where the mother was residing at the time of the birth, or at the Connecticut State Health Department, Vital Statistics Unit. Certified copies are \$20.00 each. Birth certificates may also be issued in a "wallet size." The fee for this size is \$15.00. For additional information, call 860-285-1902.

Board of Education

The administrative offices of the Board of Education are located at 601 Matianuck Avenue. Phone 860-687-2000 / Fax 860-687-2009. The Board of Education consists of nine elected members who serve two-year terms. The board sets policy for the public schools and meets on the third Tuesday of most months. Boards and Commissions

Windsor has approximately 24 boards and commissions. Most members are appointed by the Town Council, as recommended by the Republican or Democratic Town Committees. Agendas are posted on the public bulletin board outside of the council chambers at the Town Hall, at the offices of the affiliated agency and on the town website. Budget – Town and School

A copy of the budget for viewing is available at the Windsor Public Libraries, the Town Manager's Office and the Town Clerk's Office in the Town Hall and can be viewed online at townofwindsorct.com/finance/budget.

The town's fiscal year runs from July 1 through June 30. In early January, the Town Council sets the budget calendar for the upcoming year. This calendar lists dates when public input is received, as well as a schedule of budget sessions. All Town Council meetings on the budget are open to the public. The schedule is posted on the bulletin board outside council chambers and can also be viewed on the town's website.

Building Permits

A building permit gives you legal permission to start construction or alteration of a project. If your construction project does not comply with the state adopted codes, the value of your investment could be reduced. Property insurers may not cover work done without permits and inspections. Check with the Windsor Building Department to find out if you need a permit and discuss your plans. 860-285-1960 or FAQs at townofwindsorct.com/building.

Burial Certificates

Windsor Sextons return burial and disinterment permits to the Town Clerk's Office, where a database of information is maintained. 860-285-1902.

Business Registration

In compliance with state statutes, any Windsor business that is not incorporated or named after the owner must register with the Town Clerk's Office. A trade name certificate must be signed by the principal person or persons and must be notarized. The filing fee is \$5.00 per one page document. New businesses should check with the Planning & Zoning Department at 860-285-1980 to avoid future zoning issues. Call the Town Clerk's Office at 860-285-1902 if you have any questions.

Dial-a-Ride

Windsor's Dial-a-Ride provides transportation for senior citizens 60 years and older and adults receiving social security disability benefits who are without other means of daytime transportation. This service provides Windsor residents with in-town transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, banking, senior activities, and beauty/barber appointments, the library, etc. Transportation is available Monday - Friday from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Reservations must be made by noon at least two days prior to your transport date. To reserve a ride, call 860-285-1846 and

leave your name, address, telephone number, destination, the time of your appointment and duration of your appointment. Your message will be recorded. The bus driver will call you the morning of your ride to advise you of your pickup time. If you have not received your confirmation call the morning of your ride or to cancel your ride, call 860-285-1996 as soon as possible.

Dial-a-Ride for Out-of-Town

Windsor's Dial-a-Ride service also provides transportation to out-of-town appointments. Rides are available Monday through Friday to surrounding towns (see list below). Wheelchair transportation can be accommodated on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays to the towns of Bloomfield, Hartford and parts of West Hartford. Call 860-285-1992 at least seven days in advance of your scheduled appointment. Please let us know if you will be using a wheelchair, guide dog or other assistance. If you have not received your confirmation call or to cancel your ride, call 860-285-1992 as soon as possible. We also transport patrons to the following surrounding towns: East Hartford, Enfield, Farmington, Newington, West Hartford and Windsor Locks.

Directions to Windsor Town Hall

From I - 91 (North or South)

Take Exit 36 (Park Avenue - Route 178)

If traveling North, at end of ramp take a right.

If traveling South, at end of ramp take a left.

Continue to a traffic light at a "T" intersection.

Turn left onto Broad Street.

Travel approximately 1 mile. Town Hall will be on the right.

Continue past the Town Hall to the traffic light.

At the light, turn right, continue straight to the Town Hall parking lot.

Dog Licenses

Every dog over 6 months of age must be licensed annually. The license is valid from July through the following June and can be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office. Proof of a valid rabies shot must be provided before a license can be issued. With proof of spaying or neutering, a license is \$8.00 and for an unaltered dog, \$19.00. Fire Districts (Wilson and Windsor)

Fire Districts were established by the State Legislature. Today these districts exist to provide trash pick-up within the district. To pay for this service, fire districts have the power to levy and collect taxes.

Residents of the Windsor Fire District (Windsor Center area) or the Wilson Fire District (south of Wolcott Avenue) pay an additional tax each year on real estate and personal property. If you live in one of the fire districts and have questions regarding rubbish pick up, please call:

Per town ordinance, the homeowner/business is responsible for the clearing of snow from hydrants adjacent to their property within 24 hours of a completed storm.

It is closed on Fridays. Grass Clippings

The disposal of grass clippings is prohibited in Connecticut and for that reason, the landfill does not accept grass clippings. The Connecticut Department of Environmental

Protection suggests that residents use either mulching mowers or manage the clippings by "grass cycling." See the CT DEP website at ct.gov/dep for more information.

Historic District

Windsor has two historic districts - the Broad Street Green Historic District, located in Windsor center and the Palisado Avenue Historic District, which is located just north of the Farmington River along Palisado Avenue to Bissell Ferry Road. The National Register also includes structures under the heading "Eighteenth and Nineteenth Century Brick Architecture of Windsor." The Historic District Commission oversees requests by residents to change the appearance of property located in the historic district. Call 860-285-1980 for more information.

Historical Society

The Windsor Historical Society, founded in 1921, preserves and interprets Windsor's history through exhibitions, education programs, publications, active collecting and research. Its facilities include the 1758 John and Sarah Strong House, the 1767 Hezekiah Chaffee House, two exhibition galleries, an extensive research library, Hands-On-History Learning Center, museum gift shop and historic herb garden. House Numbering

Proper house numbers are required by town ordinance and numbering is important for your safety. In an emergency, valuable time is lost if Police, Fire, or Ambulance personnel cannot locate your house.

House numbers must be plain block numbers 3" high. Place the number so it can be lighted at night or is on a fence or mail box where vehicle lights will illuminate it. Place it so it is clearly visible when approaching from either direction.

Justice of the Peace

During the ensuing four years, the major political parties may continue to appoint Justices to maintain their quota, however, unaffiliated or minor party voters may not be appointed.

Mill Rate

The property tax rate is determined by dividing the total budget of the town by the Net Taxable Grand List that is produced by the Town Assessor. The Net Taxable Grand List is a listing of all the taxable real estate, motor vehicles, and personal property in the town as of the assessment date of October 1. A tax rate of one mill produces \$1 of taxes on each \$1,000 of property assessment.

The voters of the Town of Windsor have the ultimate choice as to what the mill rate will be by their participation in the budget meetings in April and the budget referendum in May. Once the budget has been approved, the Town Council does the math and sets the rate.

The Dr. Hezekiah Chaffee House, located at 108 Palisado Avenue, was built in about 1767 and was home to several generations of the Chaffee family, an 18th century doctor's office and the location of the Chaffee School for Girls in the 20th century. 860-688-3813 or visit the website at windsorhistoricalsociety.org.

Ellsworth Homestead, located at 778 Palisado Avenue, was built in 1780/1781 as the home of Oliver Ellsworth, a framer of the United States Constitution, Connecticut's first senator, third Chief Justice of the United States Supreme Court and envoy to France after the Revolution. Operated as a museum by the Connecticut Daughters of the American Revolution, "Elmwood" is open to visitors May 15 - October 15 on Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday from noon until 4:00 PM, and on the last Sunday of the month from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM. Luddy/Taylor Connecticut Valley Tobacco Museum, located at Northwest Park off Lang Road, features exhibits from Windsor's tobacco farms. The signer must be present and show adequate identification (a photo ID is required as well as a separate signature or additional photo ID). By state statute, a P.O. Box is not an acceptable address. Please be advised that if you wish your document notarized, the notary public must see the entire document. If your document is confidential, you may want to take it to an attorney to notarize.

The Town Clerk's Office does not notarize wills or living wills; these documents should be notarized by an attorney. Documents written in a foreign language cannot be notarized; contact the Secretary of the State's office, Notary Division at 860-509-6137 and request the name of a notary who can read your documents.

Parks, Trails, and Recreational Facilities in Windsor

Bissell Bridge Walkway and Boat Launch begins on the Windsor side of the State Boat Launch at the end of East Barber Street and is approximately 1.8 miles long parallel to I-291.

Custer Park is located off Custer Drive and offers a basketball court and open fields for activities for families and groups.

Deerfield Park is located off Deerfield Road with entrances on Seymour Street and Colton Street. It offers a basketball court, a playground and open fields for activities for families and groups.

Matianuck State Park trail is 1.5 miles long. It is located in the town's southwest corner at the commuter parking lot on the south side of Route 218 and a quarter mile west of the entrance to I-291- Southwest Park and Keney Park. Keney Park (mostly located in Hartford) adjoins Southwest Park and Matianuck State Park.

Northwest Park is a 473-acre facility located at 145 Lang Road and is open dawn-to-dusk. It is home to a nature

center, tobacco cultural museum and archive, maple sugar house, warming shed and cross-country ski rental center, community gardens, picnic area, world-class soccer fields, a playground and animal barn.

Sharshon Park is located on Skitchewaugh Street and has a pavilion and basketball court, a playground, summer aqua-fountain, ice skating and a field for softball.

Stroh Park is located off Ford Road and offers summer swimming at Goslee Pool, tennis and basketball courts, a playground and a picnic area.

Trent Park is located off Bloomfield Avenue and Stratford Court and offers a softball field and basketball court.

Washington Park on Lennox Avenue, near Windsor Center, has a playground, grills, pavilion and fields for volleyball and softball.

Welch Park is in the Poquonock section of Windsor on the Farmington River and has space for walking and jogging as well as a lighted baseball field, softball field, basketball and tennis courts (which are also used for ice skating in winter), grills and picnic tables, a playground and pool.

The Windsor Center Trail is located on a 43-acre site adjacent to the Farmington River at Route 159. This trail is 1.25 miles long and has direct access to over 2,000 feet of river.
