- 4. Updates on commission members, vacancies, and recruitment: There are 4 vacancies, and the Y.C is currently accepting new applications.
- 5. L.P.C. report: Y.S.B. receives the Local Prevention Grant to provide education on prevention awareness for youth. The Y.S.B. conducted a school survey in 2017 and was due for a survey in 2021, but due to Covid, it was postponed until 2022.
