1. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Eric Weiner called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. Present were Committee Members Neil Chaudhary, Jeff Dyreson, Barbara Peyton, George Slate, and Elizabeth Yetman.

2. PUBLIC COMMENT

Susan Miller discussed Sustainable CT and stated that she hopes the town does follow through with this. She also suggested that the town shows its sustainability progress online with a thermometer that goes down as the town progresses through different items.

3. COMMUNICATIONS FROM TASK FORCE MEMBERS

Mr. Slate mentioned a film he watched on climate change. He also discussed a commercial on the CT Green Bank and Solar units with a storage pack that he had seen.

Mr. Dyreson discussed Sustainable CT and the process for moving forward with that. He also discussed focusing on and promoting programs that are already out there.

Ms. Yetman attended a presentation about changing fleet vehicles to electric. There are rebates still available for those with low income for buying a used electric vehicle.

Mr. Chaudhary discussed climate emergency declarations and pointed out that the City of Hartford recently passed this resolution. He stated that this is more symbolic in nature but would require a budget allocation. He stated he is interested in proposing a recommendation for this in the final report.

Ms. Peyton had nothing to report.

Ms. Yetman provided some background on the research she had done on fees for EV charging stations on the I-91 corridor.
