Discussed rules: Just 1st & 2nd place prizes, 1 photo per person, no age criteria, must be of natural subjects around Windsor. Discussed options for names and decided on "Natural Wonders of Windsor," and that the "WoW" in the title could be emphasized on communications. Discussion on how to acquire prizes or whether to even offer tangible prizes.
