HOLIDAY SAFETY

Holidays can be a time full of joy and celebration, but they also bring a heightened risk of home fires. Take these simple steps to keep you and yours safe this holiday season:

- Keep decorations away from exits (doors and windows) and make sure everyone in your home knows your escape plan
- Keep flammable decorations away from heaters, open flames, and other sources of ignition
- Consider using flameless candles in holiday celebrations.
- Never leave lit candles unattended and be sure to use a sturdy holder, at least a foot away from flammable objects.
- Never leave your cooking unattended and keep a 3ft kid-free zone in front of the stove/oven.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS TIP OF THE SEASON

Generators are a handy tool when storms hit and the power goes out but it is important to follow these safety tips. Place generators so that exhaust fumes cannot enter the home through windows, doors, or other openings in the building. The exhaust must be directed away from the building. Follow the manufacturer's instructions and local electrical codes when connecting the power cords. Use power cords appropriate to the load.
