HEARTSafe Community



The Connecticut Department of Public Health Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS), in collaboration with the American Heart Association, aim to help Connecticut's municipalities, workplaces and campuses improve the chances of survival to anyone suffering a sudden cardiac arrest. To date, 110 of the 169 Connecticut municipalities are designated HEARTSafe Communities and Windsor has been 1 of those municipalities and first received that designation in 2014.

The HEARTSafe Designation needs to be renewed every 3 years, so the Windsor Health Department is collecting the required information to submit to the Healthcare Quality and Safety Branch of the Connecticut Department of Public Health.
