Major Priority Goals

- Current Reality: Keeping in mind that we are still realizing the aftermath of the pandemic and inflation rates are at an all-time high. The GOAL was to NOT cause further hardship to the community, while keeping in mind that we must continue to educate our students at the highest level possible.
- **Academics:** Use of research-based instructional practices to improve achievement of all students, ensuring students graduate on time and are college and career ready.
- **Climate:** Use of research-based practices to provide personalized learning experiences empowering students to be self-directed learners and increase student agency.
- Talent: Will recruit, hire, develop, and retain exemplary school leaders, teachers and support staff.
- **Systems:** Will improve outcomes for all students by enhancing Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) and aligning the work of Professional Learning communities (PLCs) and data teams.

Efforts Funded

- Maintain optimal class size throughout district
- Maintain the previously funded ESSER Grant positions to continue to support Social Emotional Learning; small group instruction and intervention; pupil support services including social work and nursing services.

Revenues

• Educational Cost Sharing Grant: \$11,547,663

• SPED Excess Cost and Tuition: \$1,436,231 (estimate)

• Health Services: \$67,925

Budget Challenges/Decreases

- Contractual Obligations/Benefits Increase of \$2,993,852 The increase is due to contractual salary increases and mitigated by retirements and benefit changes.
- Utility & Supply Costs \$235,000 Inflation rates are at an all-time high.
- Student Transportation & Fuel \$217,126
- Magnet School Tuition \$200,000 The increase is due to Magnet Schools raising tuition costs.
- Unfunded State Mandates School Indoor Air Quality & HVAC Inspections; Elementary Reading Program.

Budget Savings

- Reduced the salary line item by 11.0 FTE's which equates to approx. \$836,000.
- Reduced the salary line item by \$300,000 due to anticipated staff retirements for June 2024.
- Special Education Tuition \$400,000 The decrease is due to bringing multiple special education students back into district from outplacement facilities.
- Reduced Major Maintenance & Physical Plant Services \$269,133
- Reduced Supplies, Materials & Technology Equipment \$448,813
