## <u>Help Elderly Against Rising Taxes</u> = "HEART"

#### STATE:

Any taxpayer who is 65 years old, owns and occupies a home in Windsor, and meets certain income guidelines, may be eligible for elderly tax relief benefits under the HEART program. Depending upon their income, **qualified** applicants receive direct credits off their tax bills that range from 10% to 50%. For purposes of this program, income is defined as adjusted gross per IRS **plus** Social Security. The income guidelines for this year are as follows:

Single: \$36,000 Married: \$43,900

#### LOCAL:

In addition to the benefits described above, the Town of Windsor provides tax relief benefits for local elderly. For those individuals qualifying for the state program described above, the town provides for an additional 40% of their state elderly benefit.

Any taxpayer who is 65 years old, owns and occupies a home in Windsor, and does not meet the previously mentioned income guidelines for the state program, may still be eligible for a local benefit listed below. Single: \$36,001 to \$49,500 = \$240.00 credit Marries: \$43,901 to \$49,500 = \$360.00 credit

For both the State and Local program, income is defined as adjusted gross per IRS **plus** Social Security.

Applications must be filed between February 1st and May 15th every 2 years.

## **Federal Trade Commission Scam Warning!**

The Federal Trade Commission is getting reports about people pretending to be from the Social Security Administration (SSA) who are trying to get a person's Social Security number (SS#) and money.

In one version of the scam, the caller says your SS# has been linked to a crime (often, he says it happened in Texas) involving drugs or sending money out of the country illegally. He then says your SS# is blocked – but he might ask you for a fee to reactivate it, or to get a new number. He will ask you to confirm your SS#.

In other variations, he says that somebody used your SS# to apply for credit cards, and you could lose your benefits. He also might warn you that your bank account is about to be seized, that you need to withdraw your money, and that he'll tell you how to keep it safe.

All of these are **SCAMS**. Here's what you need to know:

- The SSA will never call and ask for your SS#. It will not ask you to pay anything. It won't call to threaten your benefits.
- Your caller ID might show the SSA's real phone number (1-800-772-1213), but that's not the real SSA calling. Computers make it easy to show any number on caller ID. You cannot trust what you see there.
- Never give your SS# to anyone who contacts you in this way. Do not confirm the last 4 digits. Do not give a bank account or credit card number ever to anybody who contacts you by phone asking for it.
- Remember that anyone who tells you to wire money, pay with a gift card, or send cash is always a scammer no matter who they say they are.

If you're worried about a call from someone who claims to be from the Social Security Administration, get off the phone. Then call the real SSA at 1-800-772 -1213.
