Windsor Forward - KINSA THERMOMETERS

As part of the Re-Open CT and Windsor Forward plan the Windsor Food Bank and Groceries To Go programs will be distributing Kinsa Thermometers. These are being distributed to record temperatures across the state. The Kinsa Thermometer works through a Bluetooth connection to the Kinsa app to share the necessary data. You have the option to set up your mobile device according to the directions included with your Kinsa Thermometer to participate in CT's data collection. This data will be collected by geographical area to identify potential clusters of illness to implement rapid response activities and reduce further spread of illness. The Town of Windsor is looking forward to working with you in our efforts to stop the spread of illness.
