ARE YOU FACING EVICTION? REMEMBER-there is no CDC Moratorium

Persons who have received a *notice to quit possession* should contact **Statewide Legal Services of CT (SLS)** at 860-344-0380 or 1-800-453-3320. Advice or referral from SLS is limited to members of households with income below 125% of the federal poverty guidelines.

Persons who receive a *summary process execution for possession* should contact legal representation RIGHT AWAY! When someone has received a summary process execution, time is of the essence! Call Greater Hartford Legal Aid directly at 860-541-5000 and tell the receptionist that they have received a summary process execution, and in which town they live.

UNITECT -EMERGENCY MONETARY HELP FOR RENTERS

Are you struggling to pay your rent and utilities **due to Covid-19**? You may qualify for the opportunity to receive -

- · Missed gas and electric outstanding payments
- · Missed rent or future rent payments.

UniteCT may pay the arrears accrued after March 13, 2020. Unite CT it a CT Dept. of Housing rental assistance program supporting CT residents who earn up to 80% of the HUD Area Median Income and their landlords. CT MOBILE FOODSHARE

The CT Foodshare sends their mobile food distribution truck to many sites in Windsor and the surrounding communities on an ongoing basis—bringing food to people in need.

The Windsor distribution is every other Wednesday afternoon from 1:30-2pm at the Hopewell Baptist Church, 280 Windsor Avenue. The January dates are the 12th and 26th. To find a mobile distribution on a day you need it, text the word FOODSHARE to 85511.

WEEKEND WHEELS STUDENT BACKPACK PROGRAM

Weekend Wheels is a supplemental food program that provides a bagful of food to elementary and middle school age children to have for the weekend. This program distributes during the school year. During the COVID pandemic, Weekend Wheels has been in a home delivery distribution mode and will continue in this format thru the school year.

Registrations are taken on a rolling basis throughout the school year. You can sign up thru the Windsor Food Bank, Windsor Social Services or with the Family Resource Coordinator at your child's school. Qualification is based on household income.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE UPDATE

Connecticut's protection against utility shutoffs has ended, effective September 15, 2021. However there are resources that are available. If you are struggling to pay your electric, water, or other utilities, you can apply for help through Operation Fuel. Call Eliana Medina-James at 860-285-1839 to discuss qualifications and see if you qualify. Or get coded for Hardship or Winter Protection, this protects your service until May 1, 2022. Ask your utility company about payment plans: For heat: CNG: 860-524-8361. For electricity: Eversource: call 860-286-2000. CT Public Utilities Regulatory Authority-1-800-382-4586. Ask for affordable payment plan.

CRT ENERGY ASSISTANCE

CRT is currently scheduling appointments for the fall/winter heating season. If you are have trouble paying your home heating bills, call 860-560-2694 to schedule your appointment.

CONNECTICUT WATER ASSISTANCE

The Connecticut Low Income Water Assistance Program is open. Get help paying your water bills. Households with annual income at or below 60 percent of the state median income can qualify for this one-time water assistance benefit. There is no asset limit. Help is available for both drinking water and waste water bills. Last day to apply is May 31, 2022.
